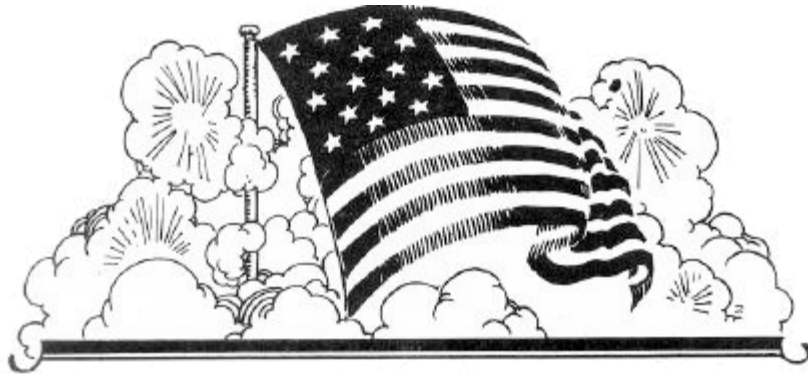

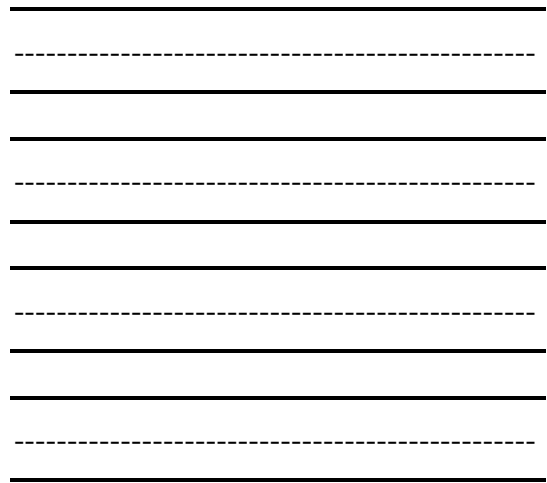

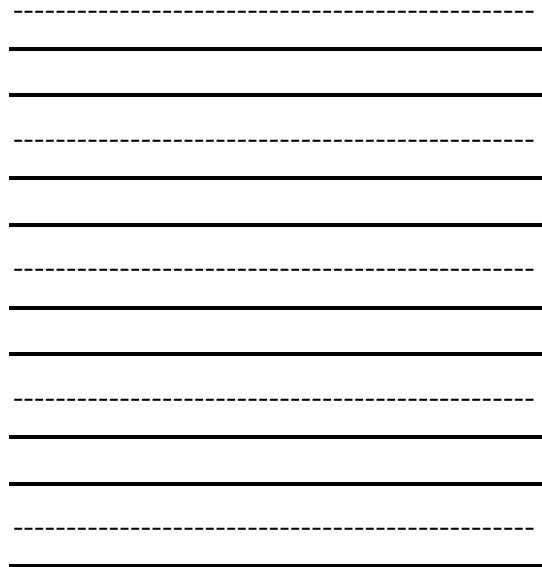

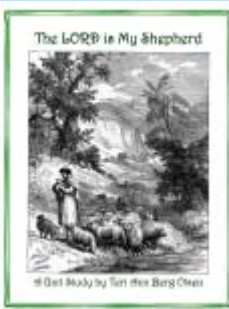
Patrick Henry Unit

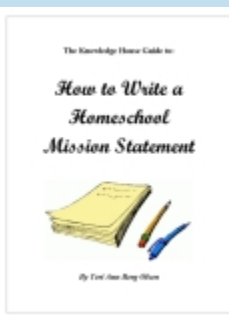
